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# **ISCA Beltway Update**

#### Transurban pulls out of expansion P3 project

- The contractor chosen to run the P3 project to expand 270 and the beltway has withdrawn from the project. You can read more about this in the news links below, as well as several opinion pieces in the Post. This news was hailed as a big victory for opponents of the project, and puts the ball in Governor Moore's court for next steps in transportation for our region.

#### MD Sierra Club continues to oppose widening

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# Northwood's Complete Renovation Delayed by One Year

The renovation of Northwood High School, which originally called for the school to shut down operations at its site on University Boulevard this summer, now is scheduled to begin in August 2024.

Higher construction costs due to inflation delayed work on large capital improvements projects in the Montgomery County Public Schools, requiring the district to seek additional funding for the project overruns. This includes the new Charles W. Woodward High School in Rockville, which will serve as Northwood's holding school during the two-year construction process.

Northwood will move to Woodward, located on Old Georgetown Road, once Phase I construction at that site is complete in August 2024.

Northwood High School will be demolished to make way for a new, energy-efficient facility that will accommodate up to 2,700 students. Current building capacity is 1,500 students, though enrollment for the 2021-22 academic year, the latest data available, was 1,784 students. If the construction schedule holds, the new Northwood will open for the 2026-27 academic year.

According to the <u>Northwood High School Addition</u> page on the MCPS facilities website, "the primary goal of the site design is to separate the bus loop from the student drop-off loop while creating a pedestrian friendly/safe access to the school building entrances." Renderings show light-filled spaces that include the cafeteria, media center and a central courtyard.

Construction at Woodward High School is moving along and is being done in two, overlapping phases. Phase I is comprised of the core academic facilities required for students to attend classes and graduate on time.

Phase II could start as early as this September, but that hinges upon County Council approval of MCPS's budget requests. If approved, Phase II could be completed by the time Northwood occupies the Woodward facility and is scheduled to be completed by February 2025. Northwood parents, teachers and staff have been advocating for facilities upgrades since the school reopened about 17 years ago. No capital improvements were made to the building during the 20-year period it was closed as the facility fell into disrepair.

According to a presentation given in <u>October 2022 on the Northwood and Woodward projects</u>, next steps include conducting focused community outreach to address questions about how the holding school will accommodate Northwood's programs, extracurricular activities and sports. Many Northwood students rely on public transportation in addition to school buses to get to and from school. This will also be addressed.
